Carlo Cambini is Professor of Industrial Organization in the Department of Management at the Politecnico di Torino, Italy. He got a degree in Economics at the faculty of Economics of the University of Pisa and he earned a Ph.D in Public Economic from Sant'Anna School of Advanced Studies, Pisa, Italy. He was Visiting Scholar at the Industrial Economic Institute (IDEI) of the University of Toulouse. In 1999 he received the Young Economist Essay Award at the *European Association for Research in Industrial Economics* (EARIE) conference in Losanne (CH).

His research focuses on industrial economics, regulatory economics and competition policy with a strong background in telecommunications, transportation, energy markets, and the Internet. He has been published in leading scientific journals such as the *RAND Journal of Economics*, *Journal of Industrial Economics*, *International Journal of Industrial Organization*, *Journal of Economics & Management Strategy*, *Journal of Comparative Economics*, *Journal of Regulatory Economics*, and also in more policy oriented journals such as *Telecommunication Policy* and *Energy Policy*. He acted as consultant for private enterprise and national agencies, such as the Italian Regulatory Authority for Communications (AGCOM), the Authority of Energy (AEEG), the Italian Ministry of Treasury, the Italian Ministry of Transport and Infrastructure and other local agencies.

Currently, he is economic member of the Scientific Committee of the Florence School of Regulation – Communications and Media, Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies – European University Institute (EUI), Florence. In 2012 he was also invited as Keynote Speaker in the 13th Regulatory Conference organized by the Australian Antitrust and Regulatory Authority (ACCC) and the Inaugural Conference on Competition and Regulation organized by the Commerce Commission of New Zealand (Wellington, October 2013).
