ΟΡΤΑ

Independent Post and Telecommunications Authority

- Administrative law, founded 1997
- Enforces Dutch Telecommunications law based on European directives
- Enforces ban on spam/malware since 2004
- Independent investigative body
- Fines (€ 450.000 max per offence)
 - -No jail sentence
 - -No 'track record' for offenders
 - Fine decisions are published though



If it walks like a duck...

- Traditional spam \rightarrow botnets
- Targeted spam through other media
 - Bluetooth
 - -SMS
 - Social networks
- Following: a case example





... swims like a duck...



- Script the creation of about 26.000 fake accounts on the n° 1 Dutch social networking site using several foreign computers
- 2. Lock down the accounts and log in to them
- 3. Script sending 3.100.000 scraps to random social network site members, promoting your RPG game
- 4. Do all this in 9 days



What was the message?



...and quacks like a duck...



- Is this spam according to Dutch law:
 - $\sqrt{\text{electronic}}$ message sent over a public communications network
 - $\sqrt{\text{commercial}, \text{charitable or idealistic content}}$
 - $\sqrt{\rm sent}$ to subscribers (non-legal persons) of a public telco service
 - $\sqrt{\text{sent without permission}}$, sender identity or valid unsubscription method





...it just might be a duck

- "but it's not e-mail!"
 - scraps are not sent to or stored in a 'mailbox'
 - this tends to confuse law people
- "scraps are public!"
 - -yes, but only visible _after_ one logs in to the community site
- "subscribers who are non-legal persons"
 - very tough part of the investigation
 - investigating the 1300 complaints at social community site lead to 3 usable complaints for OPTA
 - that's a 0,25% rate





...it just might be a duck

- New type of spam in the Netherlands
- Obviously, OPTA thinks this should be treated as spam
- Biggest challenge: find valid complaints – subscriber vs. user
