Radio Licensing

Introduction

The 2014 UEFA Champions League Final will be played in Lisbon on 24 May at Estádio do Sport Lisboa e Benfica; this is the first time that the Portuguese capital has hosted the final of this competition since 1967.

Coverage, production and organisation of the event will likely entail intensive use of radiocommunications systems.

To prevent interference occurring between the different radiocommunications systems used to cover the final, all users of radiocommunications are required to obtain radio licences in Portugal¹.

Nonetheless, there are certain situations where the use of radiocommunications systems may be exempt from licensing - these cases are detailed in Annex 4 to the National Table of Frequency Allocations (NTFA)

Radio Licence

A Radio licence is an administrative authorisation which grants the holder the right to use a radiocommunications station or network, within the scope of a radiocommunications service, in accordance with and subject to the specific terms and conditions established in the licence.

During temporary events, frequencies are allocated on a "First come, first served" basis; Licence applications should therefore be submitted in advance of the event and at least 10 days before the date on which the applicant needs the licence to become valid.

Seeing that the second legs of the semi-finals will be played on 29th and 30th April 2014, the deadline for the submission of licensing requests is 7 May 2014.

Application forms

To obtain a Portuguese radio licence, applicants should submit their requests online, directly through ANACOM's website (<u>Online Services</u> | Forms for electronic and interactive services). Alternatively, applicants can complete the "Modelo 61 ANACOM" application form and send it by email to <u>edge@anacom.pt</u>

Fees

Usage fees are calculated using the following formula:

• Applicable annual fee x (no. of days of licence validity / 360 days).

¹ Under Portuguese Law (<u>Decree-Law no. 151-A/2000, of 20 of July</u>, as amended by <u>Decree-Law no. 264/2009</u>, <u>of 28 September</u>), a radio licence is required for the use of radiocommunications stations and networks, and entails payment of a fee; the applicable fees are established in <u>Administrative Rule no. 296-A/2013 of 2 October</u>. Stations which are used without the required licence can suffer interference from or cause interference to duly licensed users. Anyone who uses an unlicensed station is committing an offence under Portuguese law and will be subject to a fine.

Radio Licensing

The annual fee depends on which services/applications are to be used.

For occasional **audio and video links**, the applicable annual fees are as follows:

SAP/SAB -Annual fee	
Video links (per frequency) ¹	€ 160.00 x LF
Audio links (per frequency) ²	€ 2,250.00

Where LF = Channel bandwidth (MHz)

For **SNG earth stations**, the applicable annual fee is as follows:

Earth stations SNG	- Annual fee
Fee per earth station	€ 2,542.00

For Private Networks of the Land Mobile Service, the applicable annual fee is as follows:

Private Networks - Annua	l fee
Fee per each channel assigned by cell	$F_r * K_1 * K_2 * K_3$

F_r - Reference Fee: € 50.00

K₁ - Coverage factor

1	Cell of 15 km radius

K₃ - Sharing factor

K₃	Sharing
1	Network with 10 or fewer mobile stations
2	Network with 11-35 mobile stations
4	Network with more than 35 mobile stations
5	Network which uses exclusive channels for national coverage

The above fees are subject to minimum values and (where applicable) additional urgency fees:

Minimum Fee: Spectrum fees applicable to stations or networks for temporary events are subject to a minimum value of 50 euros, applicable for each radiocommunications service/application to be used.

Urgency Fee: If the application for temporary licensing is submitted to ANACOM less than ten days prior to the date on which the applicant wants the radio licence to become valid, an urgency supplement will be applied to the applicable fee. This supplement is charged at 50% of the underlying fee value (minimum 75 euros).

Supervision

Technical supervision teams will ensure that all radiocommunications stations are used in accordance with current legislation and are kept free from harmful interference. Supervision teams have access to all premises, equipment, infrastructure, means of transport and services operated by persons, and all collaborating parties, subject to inspection and oversight by ANACOM, as established in ANACOM's statutes and in <u>Decree-Law no. 151-A/2000, of 20 July</u> (as amended by <u>Decree-Law no. 264/2009, of 28 September</u>). Any failure to comply with the legal rules in force in Portugal, including with the provisions of the above Decree-Law, constitutes an offence punishable with a fine.
