Kent Bressie is a partner with Harris, Wiltshire & Grannis LLP (“HWG”) and Legal Adviser to the International Cable Protection Committee (“ICPC”). As head of HWG’s international practice, he represents communications and technology companies and investors in a wide variety of cross-border and domestic regulatory and commercial matters, with a focus on telecommunications, international trade and investment, national security, and ocean and maritime matters. He works extensively in the submarine cable sector and represents operators, suppliers, investors, and serves as the legal adviser to both the ICPC and the North American Submarine Cable Association. His work includes: national security and foreign investment; cable protection and the law of the sea; telecoms licensing; corporate and commercial agreements for construction and maintenance, capacity sales, system supply, landings, and financing; environmental permitting; and market access.

As ICPC's Legal Adviser, he advises the organization and its members on a wide variety of law of the sea, public international law, cable protection, and security matters and represents ICPC before various governments, regional bodies, and international institutions and bodies, including the International Seabed Authority and the Intergovernmental Conference negotiating a new treaty for marine biodiversity beyond national jurisdiction. He has served as a consultant to the World Bank regarding the impact of WTO commitments in telecommunications on economic development.
