POSITION DESCRIPTION- No. ITSO2009-TEC

Director, Technical Affairs

MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES

- Assess the impact of technology and regulatory developments on the overall provision of public telecommunications services.
- Evaluate Intelsat's provision, on a technical basis, of services that impact the public service obligations, including the impact of technology trends, business development opportunities and product/service offerings on a global basis.
- Review decisions taken by Intelsat with respect to petitions for Lifeline Connectivity Obligation (LCO) protection and reporting to Parties on the outcome of such reviews.
- Monitor the Common Heritage issues with the ITU, the Notifying Administrations and Intelsat, on a regular basis, and report all developments to the Director General and Chief Executive Officer.
- Ensure that adequate and efficient availability of spectrum and orbital resources are available to satisfy the public service obligations.
- Monitor, research, and report on Intelsat's adherence to LCO contractual commitments and obligations.
- Monitor, research and report on Intelsat's adherence to its global connectivity and coverage and nondiscriminatory access objectives.
- Prepare position papers and lead research case studies.
- Assist in the identification of external technical experts, as needed.
- Monitor the satellite telecommunications technical developments and standardization issues with the ITU and industry that impact the provision of public service obligations.
- Carry out other duties that may be assigned.

QUALIFICATIONS AND EXPERIENCE

- Advance university degree in telecommunications engineering or a related field of education in a reputed college of advanced education.
- Over 15 years of progressively responsible experience, including a minimum of 5 years in satellite engineering, preferably in the telecom service, or more specifically, the satellite service industries.
- Ability to initiate and maintain good working relations with an interdisciplinary staff at all levels of an organization.
- Demonstrated ability as a team player at senior management level to assist in the formulation of policy.
- Ability to conduct thorough investigations to collect complete information about any technical situation under consideration.
- Effective communication ability in English (written and oral) with knowledge of French or Spanish highly desirable.
- Demonstrated knowledge and/or experience about regulation of the telecommunications sector in general is highly desirable.

COMPENSATION AND BENEFITS SUMMARY
