It consists of producing a number of weather forecasts obtained by perturbing the initial condition. The study of the stability of the family of forecasts obtained allows to a probability distribution on the forecast likelihood. At present this technique is routinely applied for numerical weather prediction and has largely improved the quality of weather forecast. The research proposed relates to the use of the ensemble members routinely produced by weather services for long-range atmospheric dispersion. More in detail it consists in verifying the impact of ensemble weather prediction on atmospheric dispersion and to what extent the use of this weather information reduces the uncertainty in dispersion prediction.

3. Unit E4 at Internal Market and Services DG

Unit E4 at DG MARKT Services Directorate is responsible for the development and the enforcement of Community policy for postal markets. The overarching objective of this policy is the completion of the Internal Market for postal services through increased competition and appropriate regulation. The unit promotes and monitors continued market reform towards greater customer focus, lower entry barriers and increased efficiency, while safeguarding the universal postal service.

The unit is currently involved in several high profile policy initiatives. - Advising on economic aspects of postal regulation (scope of USO, net cost calculation, allocation of common costs across USP services, cost accounting, USO compensation mechanisms).
- Advising on labour economics and industrial relations in the postal services markets.
- Managing quantitative analysis in the unit research activity (supervising econometric work by consulting economists, advising on data requests by NRA, monitoring and design of data collection by ESTAT).

5. Main qualifications.

The SNE should have a regulatory or an antitrust background. Experience in a network industry regulatory authority (NRA) or competition agency (CA) would be highly desirable. An academic background in industrial economics, regulatory economics or transport economics would be an asset. She or he should be able to communicate clearly in writing in English or French and present economic analysis vis-à-vis non-economists (lawyers, private parties and trade unions).

6. Languages.
