- **Em cada 10 empresas com dez e mais trabalhadores, 7 possuem ligação à Internet**
 - Em 2003, cerca de 82% utilizaram computador,
 - 70% dispunham de ligação à Internet e
 - 26% possuíam website.
 - As compras electrónicas foram realizadas por aproximadamente 12% daquelas empresas e cerca de 3% das mesmas efectuaram vendas através do mesmo meio.

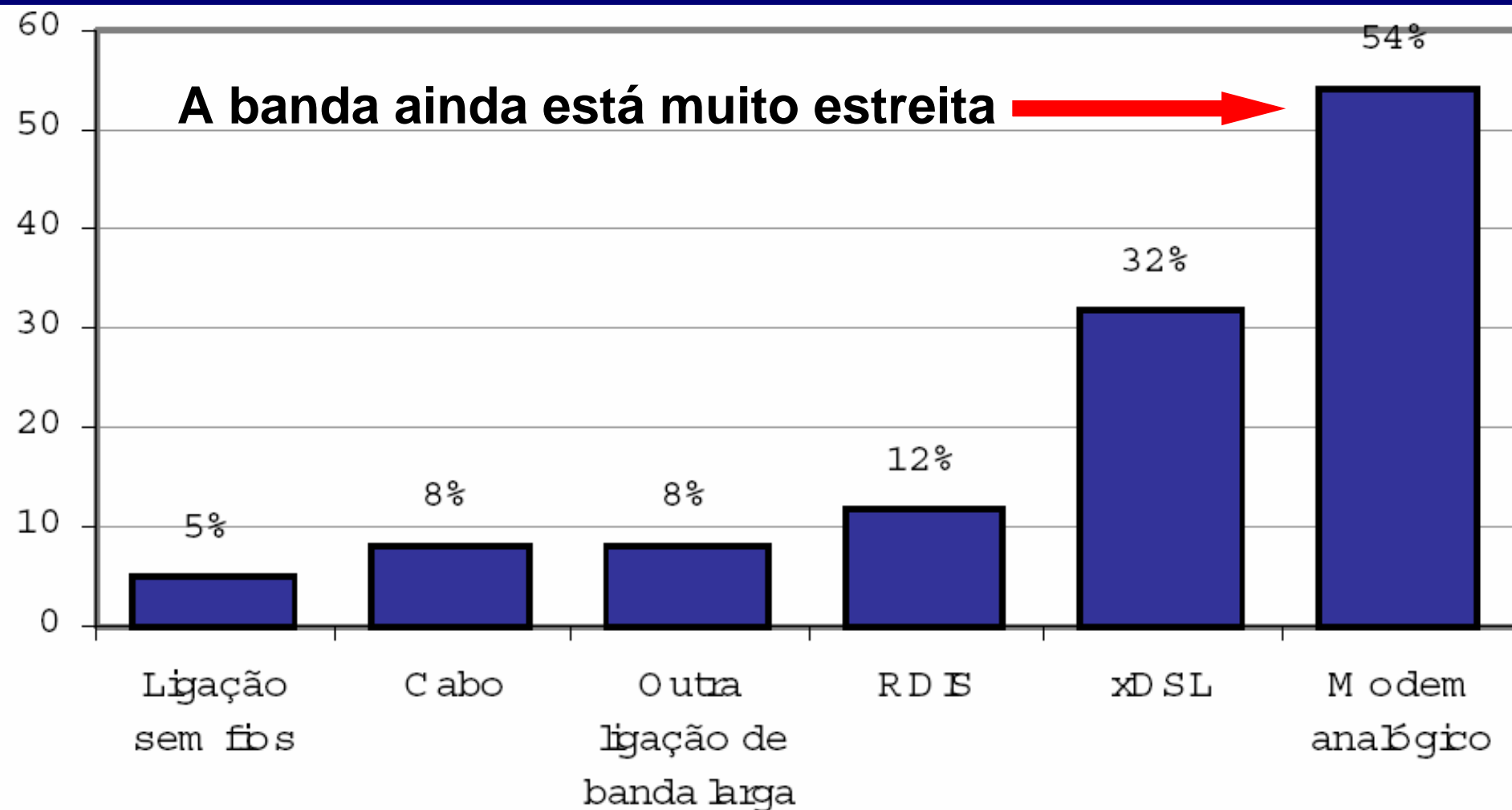

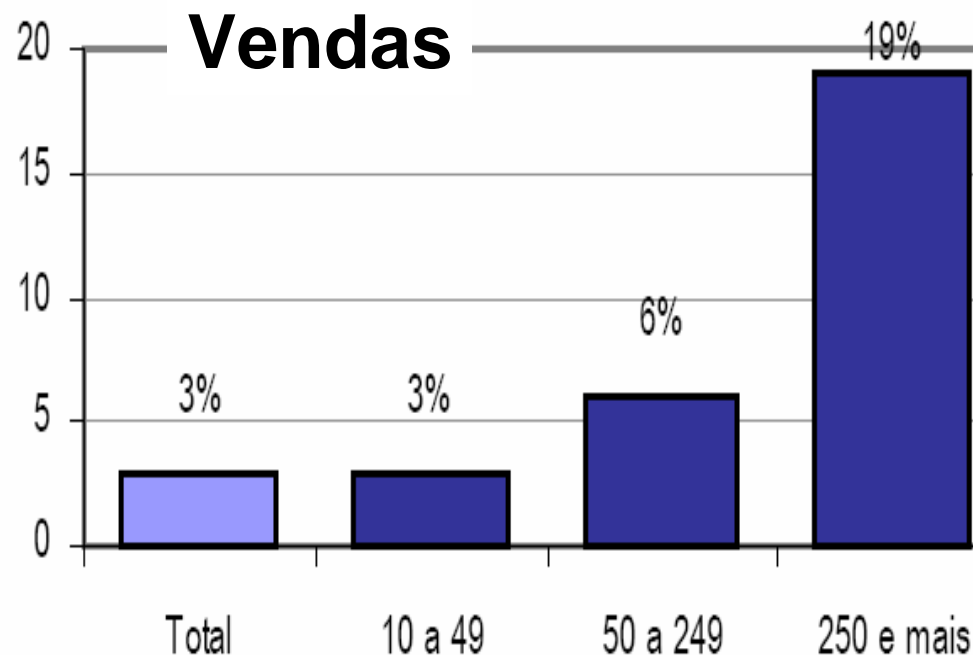
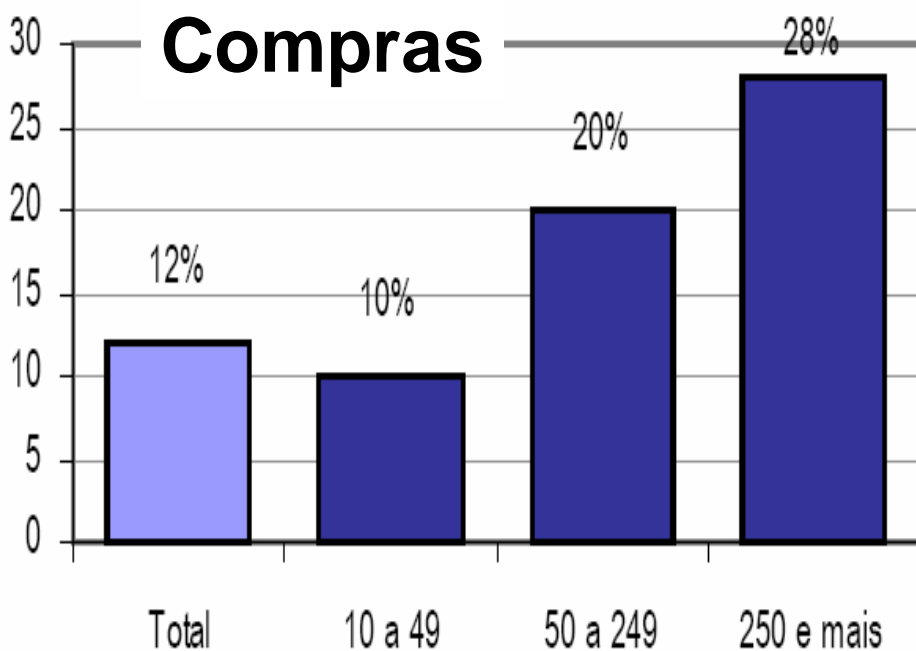

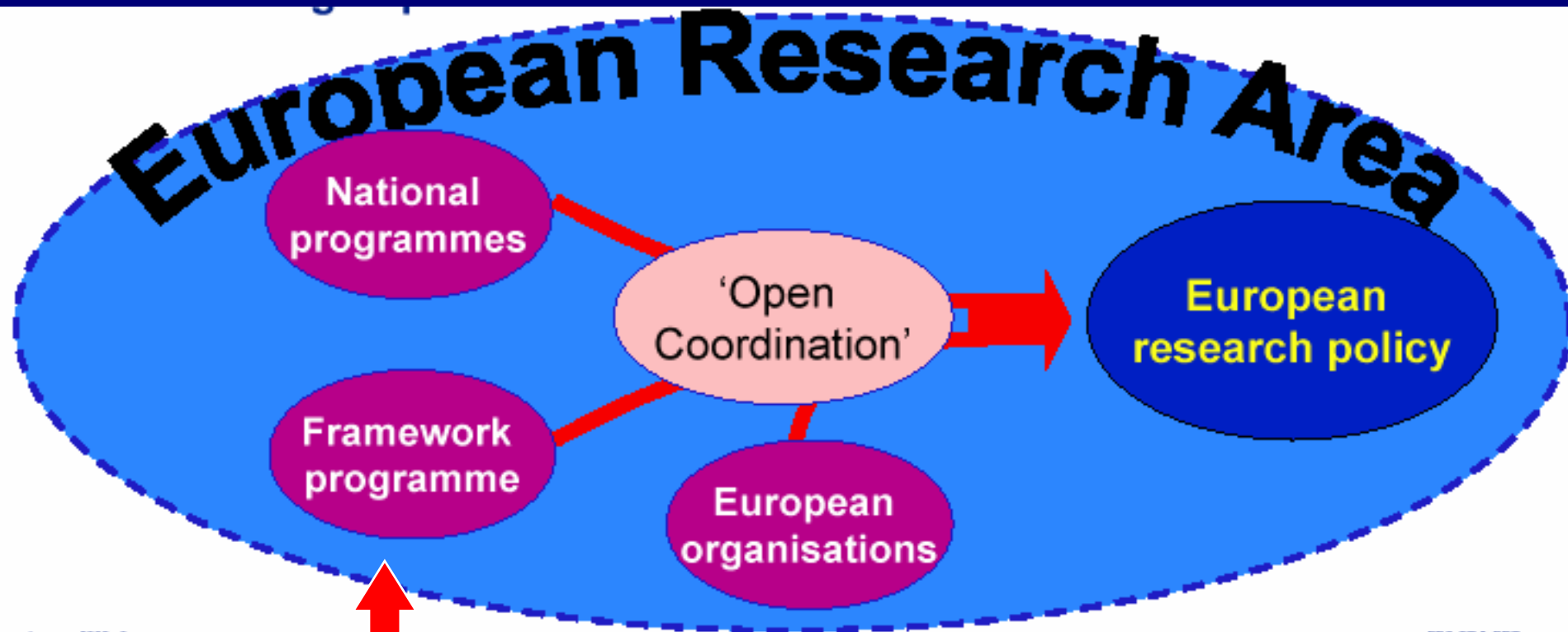


Comércio electrónico vs. número de pessoas (%)



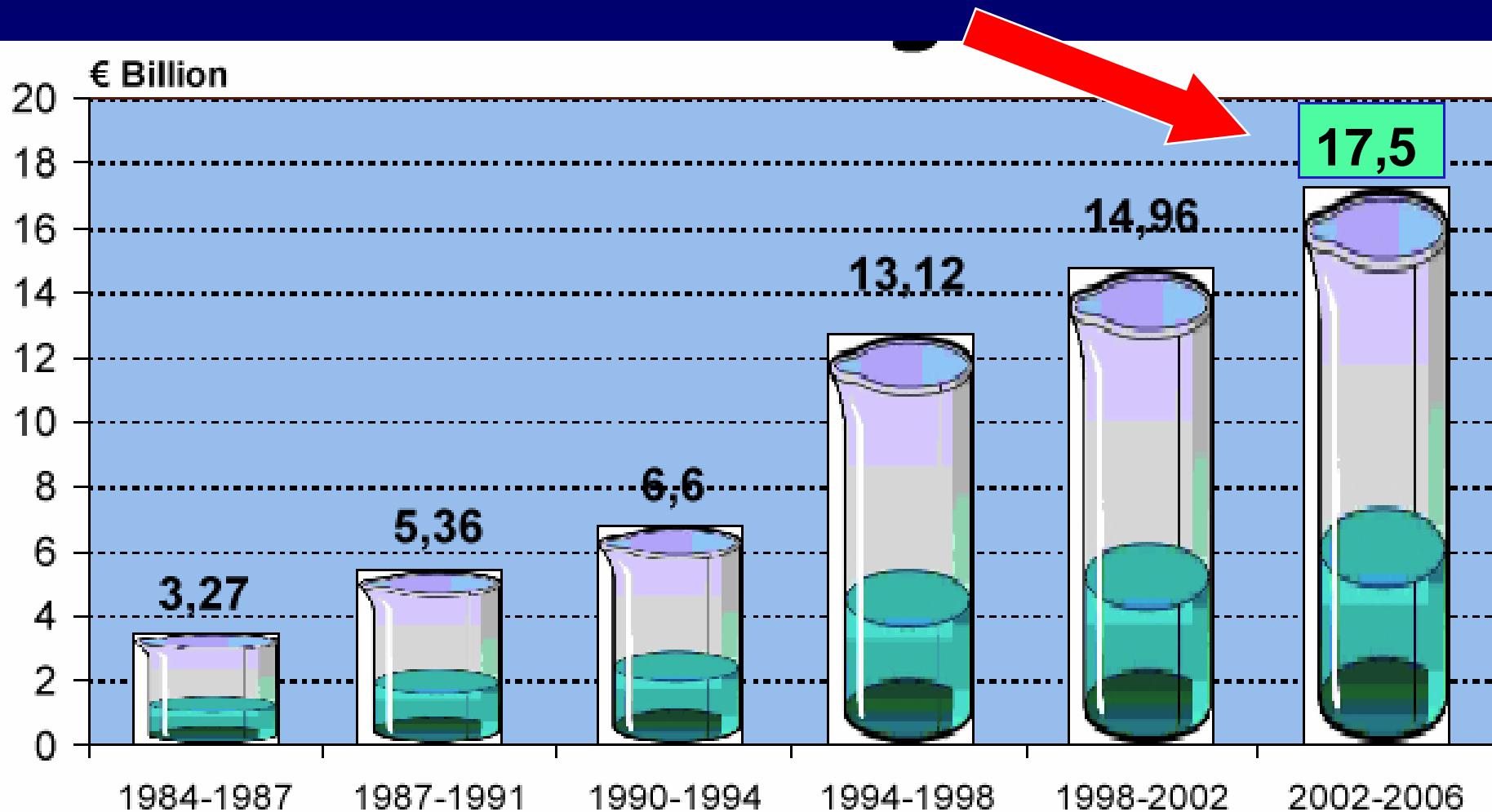

eContent is a market oriented programme which aims to support the production, use and distribution of European digital content and to promote linguistic and cultural diversity on the global networks.

14.02.2004 Fourth Call for proposals launched - closing date 14 May 2004

The Commission launched the [4th Call for Proposals](#) for the eContent programme on the 14th February 2004. The call seeks proposals for **demonstration projects** for Cross-border information services based on public sector information (Action line 1.1.) and strengthening the linguistic infrastructure (Action Line 2.2.).

Third Call Continuous submission scheme deadline moved to 14 May 2004

The deadline for the submission of proposals for **feasibility projects** under the [3rd call for proposals, continuous submission scheme](#) has been moved to the 14th May 2004 at 17h00 (Luxembourg time) to coincide with the deadline for the fourth call. The Commission published a [Corrigendum](#) on the 14th February 2004 replacing the previous call text. This call addresses all parts of Action Lines Public sector information (1) and Multilingual and multicultural environment (2).

A European eLearning programme

Information and communication technologies (ICT), properly used, contribute to the quality of education and training and to Europe's move to a knowledge-based society.

The European Commission has been very active in supporting and complementing the efforts of EU Member States in this field. Through the eLearning Initiative and Action Plan, it has gained considerable experience in encouraging co-operation, networking and exchange of good practice at a European level.

The eLearning programme is a further step towards realising the vision of technology serving lifelong learning. It focuses on a set of actions in high priority areas, chosen for their strategic relevance to the modernisation of Europe's education and training systems.

Community funding

It is sometimes difficult to gain an overview of the European Union's various cultural activities and programmes. In addition to the Culture 2000 programme, which specifically targets cultural cooperation, many European programmes have a cultural dimension in various areas of activity: support for the cultural industries, technological research, education and training in the arts, regional development, cooperation with third countries, and so on.



These programmes are managed by different Directorates-General and departments within the European Commission and have their own rules regarding operation and eligibility. It is therefore advisable to first consult the documents available on the various websites of the Commission's Europa server before taking part in one of these programmes. Project promoters may also obtain information and assistance from [Commission representations](#), [Culture Contact Points](#), national agencies for the various programmes and regional institutions in the Member States, and from [Commission Delegations in non-member countries](#).

Cultural cooperation

The Culture 2000 programme helps to finance Community cooperation in all areas of the arts, such as the performing arts, visual and fine arts, literature, music, history and cultural heritage. The programme has been allocated EUR 167 million for the period 2000-2004 and aims to promote the cultural diversity of the European Union, creativity, exchanges between those involved in the cultural sector in the EU, and to make culture more accessible to the public. Financial assistance is awarded to projects selected on the basis of a call for proposals, which is published at the beginning of each year.

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CRAFT AND SMALL BUSINESSES



Backbone of the European economy

There are 25,9 million non-primary private enterprises in Europe (19 countries of the European Economic Area plus candidate countries to the European Union). 99% are crafts and small businesses with less than 50 employees. Crafts and small businesses employ more than 53% of Europe's workforce (around 80 million people) and are responsible for half of Europe's total turnover. The average company size in Europe is 5 occupied persons. Small businesses and crafts enterprises are therefore the rule in Europe and not the exception. Small and crafts businesses are a key source of jobs and a breeding ground for business ideas. Small businesses are the main driver for innovation and employment as well as social and local integration in Europe. This role has largely been recognised by the European Union and policy makers. (1999 Data available in the [Observatory Report 2002/2](#))

PRIORITY ACTIONS FOR 2003 - 2004

- ❑ **Develop crafts and small enterprises' capacities for growth in the Internal Market**
- ❑ **Promote a more favourable environment for crafts and small enterprises**
- ❑ **Promote the entrepreneurial spirit of specific groups of entrepreneurs, such as**
 - women entrepreneurs,
 - young entrepreneurs,
 - co-entrepreneurs and entrepreneurs from ethnic minorities.

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The CREA programme does not provide investment finance to individual businesses, nor does the Commission intervene in the investment decisions of the seed capital funds supported under CREA. Funds make decisions independently, based on their usual selection criteria.

Seed Capital - CREA

Under the CREA programme, the Commission supports seed capital funds by helping to cover part of their operating costs during their start-up phase.

The Commission may cover up to 50% of the operating costs, to a maximum of EUR 500,000 over 3 years. CREA aims to:

- stimulate the supply of equity finance for the creation and transfer of innovative smaller businesses (fewer than 50 employees) with growth and job creating potential by supporting seed capital funds or similar organisations;
- create a community-wide network for seed capital funds and promote the exchange of best practices and training.

Who can receive support from CREA?

New or recently created seed capital funds:

- with at least EUR 4 million available for investments in small enterprises.

The Cohesion Fund finances projects designed to improve the environment and develop transport infrastructure in Member States whose per capita GNP is below 90% of the Community average. In this way it contributes to sustainable development in the Member States concerned as well as strengthening cohesion in the European Union.

The Member States qualifying for the period 2000-06 are the same as for 1993-99: Ireland, Greece, Spain and Portugal. The progress made by each of these countries will be reviewed before the end of 2003 and the socio-economic indicators used will be updated to see whether they still qualify for assistance.

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The European Regional Development Fund

ERDF resources are mainly used to cofinance:

- productive investment leading to the creation or maintenance of jobs;
- infrastructure;
- local development initiatives and the business activities of small and medium-sized enterprises.

In practice, all development areas are covered: transport, communication technologies, energy, the environment, research and innovation, social infrastructure, training, urban redevelopment and the conversion of industrial sites, rural development, the fishing industry, tourism and culture.

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Interreg III: the strands A, B, C and the programmes

Interreg III is made up of 3 strands and has a total budget of 4,875 billion euro (1999 prices).

- **Strand A : [cross-border cooperation](#)**

Supplementing the three strands, a maximum of EUR 50 million (2001 prices) is used to finance networks promoting the sharing of experiences and best practices, which concerns the two programmes ESPON and INTERACT. The European Spatial Planning Observatory Network (ESPON) is a programme financed jointly by the European Union and the fifteen Member States, as well as other neighbouring states. It is a network of cooperation between national spatial planning institutes and will focus on the observation and analysis of territorial and regional development trends in Europe, financing research studies in the field of spatial planning. A secretariat in Luxembourg provides coordination - website: www.espon.lu. The programme INTERACT (INTERreg - Animation, Coordination, Transfer) seeks to build on the experience and lessons of INTERREG I and INTERREG II, and to improve the effectiveness of implementation of INTERREG III during the current programming period. It will basically provide for exchange of experiences and networking, information dissemination and support to those involved in managing Interreg III programmes, as well as providing information on the INTERREG activities to national, regional and local actors and the public in general.

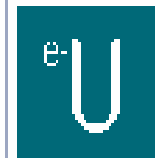
